This will be our first face to face Open Day since October 2019, its great to be back and we look forward to meeting you. Come along and learn about the many exciting career opportunities available in agriculture.


Tours ongoing from 10.00am to 1.00pm, no need to register in advance. Eircode is V94V8N3.

Grass

The 39th grass cover of the year was completed on Thursday last by the dairy herd management and drystock management students. Growth rate was 38 Kgs DM/Ha/day and the demand is 22 Kgs DM / LU/Day.

47% of the platform is grazed to date, with at target of 48% to be grazed by 28^{th} October and 60% by 04^{th} November.



Dairy Herd

Cows are now housed at night in order to maintain grass in the diet throughout the month of November. Milk butterfat is at 5.23% and 4.11% protein. On Saturday vet Robert Flahive hoof trimmed cows which were identified as needing attention following Thursdays locomotion scoring. Our dairy herd management students vaccinated the entire dairy herd on Monday and Wednesday with Bovilis Bovipast RSP.



Beef Enterprise

Store cattle are now housed and are beginning their finishing programme.



On Thursday our drystock management students dosed the weanling calves with Albex to treat for worms. They were also vaccinated with Bovilis Bovipast RSP and will receive a booster shot in 4 weeks times before housing.

Sheep Enterprise

Our Drystock Management students applied raddle to our four breeding rams on Monday before they joined the ewes. A total of 111 ewes/ewe lambs have now gone to the rams. Ewe lambs are being bred to Charolais and all mature ewes are being bred to Belclare.



Student Visits & Activities

It was yet another busy week for our students. On Monday our Higher Certificate in Agriculture – Mechanisation year 1 students and B. Eng students visited Templetuohy

Farm Machinery in Tuam and Malone Machinery in Claremorris.
